

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 22, 1996 - 1000 MST  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION: Fire activity continued in the Southern Area, with increased activity occurring in Texas. Resource mobilization through NICC consisted of radio equipment, engines and miscellaneous overhead to Texas. The Southwest Area activated an airtanker for initial attack, released a few hours later.

Southern Area Fire Information:

Texas State experienced numerous new fires, however, no specific information was available at the time of this report.

UPLAND ISLAND, NF'S of Texas. Improved weather conditions resulted in 70% containment. Weather forecasted for today is hot and windy. ADA COMPLEX, Muskogee Area Office, Ada Agency, BIA. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bollman) is assigned. Ten fires are involved in this complex, five new starts yesterday added 600 acres. Homes, oil and gas facilities remain threatened.

OUTLOOK: Texas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Arkansas and the Gulf Coast states will continue to be unseasonably warm and dry through Friday. South winds will develop across Texas, Oklahoma and Missouri this afternoon and will spread into the Gulf States on Friday. A cold front passage will bring a breezy windshift and cooler temperatures to Missouri, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Texas with scattered showers and thundershowers on Friday. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's. A high wind watch is posted in New Mexico for the northeast quarter, eastcentral plains, central valleys, central highlands and southern mountains. A high wind advisory is posted elsewhere. A strong upper level trough will move through New Mexico today and tonight bringing very windy conditions. The mountains and northwest will have scattered rain and snow showers while the east and south remain dry. High temperatures will range from the 50's in the north to lower 90's in the southwest. Fire activity is expected in the Southern and Southwest Areas as a result of windy conditions.
