CURRENT SITUATION: Alaska mobilized another Type II Incident Management Team yesterday afternoon. Increased fire activity occurred in southern California. Demobilization of resources continued from the Southwest Area. Resource mobilization through NICC remained minimal.

Alaska Large Fires:

KAZAKOF BAY, Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Wehking) is assigned. Evacuation of the logging camp is now a low probability.

HIDDEN CREEK, Kenai National Wildlife Refuge and Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Dube) is assigned. The fire jumped Skilak Loop Road yesterday. Four additional crews have been ordered.

Alaska has 1 fire in confinement/limited strategy for 2,100 acres.
