

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, AUGUST 21, 1998 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack fire activity again increased due to lightning. New starts were quickly contained. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a mobile shower unit, lead plane, helicopters, equipment, crews and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme indices continue to be reported in Texas, Michigan, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Oregon, Washington, California and Arizona.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

NORTH FORK COMPLEX, Salmon-Challis NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Richer) is assigned. The fires are located approximately twenty miles west of Salmon. This complex is made up of the Bear Basin and Sheepeater fires. Excess crews will begin to shift from the Bear Basin to Sheepeater today. Structure protection continues around the historic town of Shoup. Burn out operations began yesterday to secure the northern line. Crews were ferried across the Salmon River in preparation for a burn out on the west side.

MAIN SALMON COMPLEX, Salmon-Challis NF. An Interagency Fire Use Management Team (O'Brien) is assigned. This complex is located 40 miles west northwest of Salmon. The complex consists of eleven fires burning in the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness on the Salmon-Challis, Payette, Nez Perce and Bitterroot National Forests. Demobilization began on the Cayuse and Lantz Bar fires. Dry lightning ignited several new starts in the area yesterday.

SPRING, Ft. Hall Agency, ID. This fire is located eight miles southwest of Pocatello. Thunderstorms with winds in excess of sixty miles per hour caused extreme rates of spread. Unharvested grain fields, structures, outbuildings, power lines, and cultural resources are currently threatened. Some residents were evacuated, but were later allowed to return.

JACKASS, Salmon-Challis NF. This fire is 30 miles southwest of Salmon. The fire was moderately active.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRES:

WEST FORK WILDERNESS FIRES, Bitterroot NF. An Interagency Fire Use Management Team (Wallace) is assigned. Fire behavior included torching with increased temperatures and decreased humidities. Structure protection remains in place for historic cabins at Schofield and Horse Heaven.

NORTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

NORTH 25, Wenatchee NF. This fire is located 27 miles northwest of Chelan. Crews are continuing rehabilitation work.

SQUARE LAKE, Deschutes NF. This fire is located north of Santiam Pass. A youth camp at Round Lake, two miles from the incident, remains evacuated. The Pacific Crest Trail north of Highway 20 is also closed to entry.

OUTLOOK:

Sunny and warm conditions are expected over California and Nevada while partly cloudy skies with scattered afternoon showers and thunderstorms prevail over Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, Utah, Arizona and New Mexico. The most active area for afternoon thunderstorms is expected over eastern Arizona, New Mexico and eastern Utah. Although most of these storms

will be dry, a few could produce locally heavy downpours, especially over the higher mountains. High temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's, except 70's and 80's for the Pacific Coastal regions and 90's to 110 over the deserts of Arizona and southern Nevada.
