

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SATURDAY, MAY 26, 2001 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity increased in the Northwest and the Great Basin. New large fires were reported in Florida, Oregon and Montana. Units in Florida, Texas, Montana and Arizona reported very high to extreme fire indices.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

DIXIE/LAFAYETTE COMPLEX, Florida Division of Forestry. This complex, which includes the Mallory Swamp fire, is approximately 20 miles east of Perry, FL. Weather and fuels have made containment attempts difficult. All efforts are focused on structural protection.

BLOUNT PASTURE, Georgia State Forestry Commission. The fire is near Darian, GA. in McIntosh County. The fire escaped containment lines yesterday, but no structures were lost.

VICTOR ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. The fire is 20 miles south of Chipley, FL. No new information.

PIT COMMAND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is five miles west of Haines, FL. Burn-out operations will be conducted around homes in the area. An evacuation plan in place. Old Polk Road and State road 557 are closed to traffic.

SIMMONS ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 15 miles east of Lake City, FL. No new information.

SEAGROVE, Florida Division of Forestry. The fire, which started on 5/15, is one mile from Seagrove Beach, FL. Spotting and low humidity are hampering containment efforts.

RACE POND, Georgia State Forestry Commission. This fire is approximately 20 miles north of Waycross, GA. Crews will continue to monitor the fire perimeter.

ARABIA BAY, Georgia State Forestry Commission. The fire is near Homerville, GA in Clinch County. The fire was active on the southern perimeter with several structures threatened.

HARTZOG, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire, formerly called the Bay Top/Hartzog, is four miles west of Orlando, FL. Crews continue to monitor the fire.

CRAWFORD ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 20 miles northwest of Jacksonville, FL. No new information was reported.

BEAR ISLAND, Big Cypress National Park. This fire is 50 miles east of Naples, FL. The fire received 2 inches of rain. Most resources will

demobilize today.

WARRIOR POINT, Carson City Field Office, BLM. This fire is located 50 miles northeast of Reno, NV. Strong afternoon winds hampered containment efforts.

PEAVINE II, Humbolt-Toiyabe NF. This fire is being pushed by strong winds with structures within ½ mile of the incident. A Type 1 helicopter is aiding in initial attack efforts.

NORTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

HORSESHOE, Prineville District BLM. This lightning-caused fire is 15 miles west of Condon, OR. Fuels involved are grass and sagebrush. Wind gusts up to 12 mph are causing containment challenges.

TUNNEL, Prineville District BLM. This fire is located 9 miles south of Maupin, OR. The fire is burning in grass and sagebrush and some structures in the area are threatened.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR NORTHERN AND WEST CENTRAL FLORIDA FOR LOW HUMIDITY ***

A weak front moving across Florida will dissipate with most of the remaining moisture continuing over southern Florida. Northern and central Florida will be partly cloudy with minimum relative humidity from 30 to 40 percent. Temperatures will be in the 80's with winds light and variable at less than 15 mph statewide.

A trough off the Northwest coast moving inland will bring partly cloudy skies and scattered thunderstorms to Washington and Oregon, mainly east of the Cascades. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's with northwest winds at 5-15 mph. Minimum relative humidity will be 15-30 percent inland.

Nevada will be mostly sunny with isolated thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's, and near 100 in southern Nevada with southwest winds at 15-25 mph. Minimum relative humidity will be 10-20 percent.
