

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, APRIL 7, 2006 – 0800 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was moderate nationally with 288 new fires reported. Thirteen new large fires were reported, eleven in the Southern Area and one each in the Rocky Mountain and Northern Rockies Areas. Seven large fires were contained five in the Southern Area, and one each in the Rocky Mountain and Northern Rockies Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Kansas and Indiana.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

WEST TEXAS IA, Texas Forest Service. A Texas State Type 2 Incident Management Team (Hanneman) is assigned in Midland, TX. The Team is assisting local jurisdictions with managing initial and extended attack fires and a fire prevention program within the 140 million acre fire management response area. Three new fires were reported. Acres, structure losses and costs represent cumulative fire activity for the response area.

CEMENT, Anadarko Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs. This fire is one mile southwest of Cement, OK in grass. Livestock and oil wells are threatened. Residences in the town of Cement have been evacuated. Roads closures are in effect. Extreme fire behavior was reported.

KRPT, Anadarko Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs. This fire is one mile north of Anadarko, OK in grass. Residences have been evacuated and highway 281 has been closed. Extreme fire behavior was reported.

BOWERS CITY, Texas Forest Service. This fire started on private land south of Pampa, TX in grass. Five hundred residences were evacuated. The fire is being managed under West Texas, IA. No further information was received.

FAIN PLANT, Texas Forest Service. This fire started on private land north of Amarillo, TX in grass. The fire is burning in river breaks, limiting access to the fire. The fire is being managed under West Texas, IA. No further information was received.

FORSAN, Texas Forest Service. This fire started on private land 13 miles southeast of Big Spring, TX in grass. The fire is being managed under West Texas IA. No further information was received.

LEWIS MOUNTAIN, Shenandoah National Park. This fire is four miles east of Grottoes, VA in leaf litter. Some trails have been closed. Moderate fire behavior was reported.

DICKIE RANCH, Texas Forest Service. This fire started on private land south of Woodson TX, in grass. One home was evacuated. The fire is being managed under West Texas IA. No further information was received.

FORSAN #2, Texas Forest Service. This fire started on private land four miles southeast of Forsan, TX in grass. This fire is being managed under West Texas IA. No further information was received.

CRANE, Texas Forest Service. This fire started on private land eight miles southwest of Crane, TX in grass. The fire is being managed under West Texas IA. No further information was received.

OUTLOOK:

Fire Weather Watches: Portions of eastern New Mexico and west Texas for strong winds and low humidity.

Weather Discussion: A potent low pressure system and surface cold front will move across the Plains today creating strong winds across the southern Rockies, and the central and southern Plains. Dry conditions will combine with these winds mainly over southeastern New Mexico, and portions of Texas and Oklahoma. Elsewhere, low relative humidity continues over portions of the Southeast and Florida.
