

**INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, JUNE 11, 2006 – 0800 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2**

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 188 new fires reported. Seven new large fires (*) were reported, three in the Southwest Area, two in the Western Great Basin Area, and one each in the Alaska and Northern California Areas. Eight large fires were contained, three in the Southwest Area, two in the Eastern Great Basin Area and one each in the Western Great Basin, Northern California and Rocky Mountain Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Nebraska, New Mexico, Mississippi, Nevada, North Dakota, Utah, and Texas.

SOUTHWEST AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

BLACK MOUNTAIN COMPLEX, Phoenix District, Bureau of Land Management. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Philbin) is assigned. This fire is 11 miles northeast of Bullhead City, AZ in brush. The complex consists of the Union, Secret, Nutt, and Airpark fires. Several residences in Golden Valley were evacuated. Burn out operations conducted to protect the community were successful. Moderate rates of spread were observed on the Secret fire, and the spread of the fire on the Nutt and Union fires has been halted.

INDIAN, Kaibab National Forest. This fire is 19 miles southwest of Jacob Lake in grass. Active fire behavior was reported.

POTATO COMPLEX, Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest. This complex is 10 miles northwest of Heber-Overgaard, AZ in ponderosa, pinyon pine and grass. Utility infrastructure, wildlife habitat and cultural resources remain threatened. Steep terrain and heavy fuel loading are impeding containment efforts. Crowning, torching and spotting were reported.

CEMENT - WFU, Gila National Forest. This lightning-caused Wildland Fire Use (WFU) is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is burning six miles northeast of Gila Cliff Dwelling National Monument in hardwood litter. Minimal fire activity was reported. The fire is being monitored by the air. This will be the last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

CLAYTON, Gila National Forest. This fire is five miles east of Willow Creek, NM in brush and timber. No further information was received.

SKATES- WFU, Gila National Forest. A Fire Use Management Team (Hall) is assigned. This lightning caused Wildland Fire Use (WFU) incident is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is burning 12 miles northeast of Silver City, NM in timber. Creeping, isolated torching and consumption of the heavy fuels was reported.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ANNABELLA, Fish Lake National Forest. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Muir) is assigned. This fire is three miles southwest of Annabella, UT in timber. Seasonal residences are threatened. Steep terrain and difficult access are impeding containment efforts. Rapid rates of spread with short crown runs, torching, and spotting were reported.

NORTH SAND MOUNTAIN, Richfield Field Office, Bureau of Land Management. This fire is 25 miles west of Nephi, UT in grass, brush and pinyon pine. No further information was received.

BLACKBIRD MINE, Fishlake National Forest. A Fire Use Management Team (Stanich) is assigned. This lightning-caused Wildland Fire Use (WFU) incident is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is burning six miles east of Marysvale, UT in brush, grass and mixed conifer. No new information was reported.

ALASKA AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

PARKS HWY, Fairbanks Area Forestry, Alaska Division of Forestry. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Kurth) is assigned. This fire a half mile southeast of Nenana, AK in black spruce, tundra and grass. Numerous residences, commercial property and utility infrastructure remain threatened. Voluntary evacuations remain in effect for the community of Nenana. Running, crowning, torching, spotting and wind driven fire behavior were reported.

JARVIS CREEK, Delta Area Forestry, Alaska Division of Forestry. This fire is eight miles south of Delta Junction, AK in black spruce. Residences and commercial property are threatened. High winds are impeding containment efforts. Creeping fire behavior along with occasional torching and spotting were reported.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ROCKY, Ely District, Bureau of Land Management. This fire is 19 miles north of Hiko, NV in grass and sagebrush. Extreme fire behavior with terrain driven runs and individual tree torching was reported.

MOONLIGHT, Winnemucca Field Office, Bureau of Land Management. This fire is 26 miles southwest of McDermitt, NV in grass and sagebrush. Erratic winds, steep terrain and difficult access are hampering containment efforts. Running, backing and short range spotting were reported.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ARRASTRE, San Bernardino National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Garwood) is assigned. This fire is six miles east of Big Bear City, CA in pinyon juniper. Numerous structures remained threatened. Minimal fire activity was reported.

ABERDEEN, San Bernardino Unit, California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. This fire is 15 miles north of Independence, CA in chaparral, sage and grass. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

FERGUSON ROCK SLIDE, Sierra National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This incident is northeast of Mariposa, CA. The Forest is closed around the slide area and Caltrans has closed the road beyond the Forest closure area. Downstream fisheries and tourism infrastructure are threatened.

OUTLOOK:

Red Flag Warning: In effect for Sunday for parts of central Nevada due to gusty winds and low RH. For Strong South Winds over the North Slopes of the Alaska Range, Southern Interior and the Kuskokwim Valley. Portions of northwest Arizona for strong winds and low humidity. Sunday afternoon and evening in southwest and west central deserts and south central mountains of Utah for strong winds and low RH.

Fire Weather Watch: In effect for Monday for most of central, east-central and southern Nevada due to gusty winds and low RH. For Alaska for strong winds in the Copper River Basin. Portions of northwest Arizona for strong winds and low humidity. For much of west and southern Utah for strong winds and low relative humidities.

Weather Discussion: A large low pressure trough will move into the Pacific Northwest and along the West Coast today with high pressure over the central US. Windy and dry conditions will continue from southeastern California, across northwest Arizona and the Great Basin, into the western Rocky Mountain Area. Relative humidity will increase over Florida today with driest conditions over northern Florida and adjacent southeastern states. In Alaska, strong south winds and low relative humidity will continue over portions of the interior.
