

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 WEDNESDAY, JULY 3, 1996 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

*** SAFETY COMES FIRST ON EVERY FIRE, EVERY TIME ***

CURRENT SITUATION: Initial attack activity continued throughout the West. New large fires were reported in the Eastern Great Basin, Southwest and Northwest Areas. Good progress was reported on some of the California large fires. Resource mobilization through NICC was moderate.

Southern California Large Fires:

BEE, San Bernardino NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Dague) is assigned. This fire is burning 2 miles west of Idyllwild. Dozer lines have been constructed around Pine Cove and Idyllwild to protect the communities. Evacuations in these areas remain in effect as the fire is within 500 yards of outlying buildings.

BICHOTA COMPLEX, Angeles NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Cooney) is assigned. This fire is located north of Azusa, near Highway 39. The complex consists of the BICHOTA (1,800 acres) and ELDORADO (200 acres) fires. The Eldorado fire is contained. Fire activity on the Bichota decreased, allowing crews to make good progress. Demobilization has begun and rehabilitation is almost complete.

DIEGO, (Previously called JUAN DIEGO FLATS) San Bernardino NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Giachino) is assigned. This fire is burning on Cahuilla Mountain and moving in a southerly direction toward the town of Anza. The fire was less active last night, and good progress was made.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

BRIDGER COMPLEX, Kaibab NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Macdonald) is assigned. This fire is 25 miles southwest of Jacob Lake, AZ on the border of Grand Canyon NP. This complex includes the BRIDGER KNOLL/JUMP and PASS fires. Fire activity remained quiet on all portions of the fire, except the southwest corner which is under a confinement suppression strategy. Mop-up and rehabilitation of the Jump fire in nearly complete. Demobilization is continuing with plans to transition control of the fire to a local Team this afternoon.

BLACK TANK, Truxton Canyon Agency, BIA. This fire is approximately 30 miles northeast of Kingman, AZ. This fire was started by dry lightning.

Three fires are in a confinement suppression strategy totalling 20,144 acres.

55K|Eastern Great Basin Area Large Fires:

NORTH SHORE, Boise District, BLM. This fire is burning east of Boise, ID. Winds caused the fire to burn actively last night. Two homes are threatened and structure protection is in place.

NOTCH BUTTE, Boise District, BLM. This fire is burning in heavy cheat grass 40 miles west of Twin Falls, ID. Current threat is to scattered farms. Heavy fuels, brisk winds and high temperatures are hampering control efforts.

One fire is burning in a confinement suppression strategy for 650 acres.

OUTLOOK:

** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR DRY LIGHTNING IN CENTRAL NEVADA TODAY ** A ridge of high pressure will remain over the Rockies while a

trough of low pressure moves closer to the Pacific Northwest. Thunderstorms will continue over the Southwest and will increase in the Great Basin through the Northern Rockies. Winds will increase by afternoon from northern California north and east across to the Northern Rockies. High temperatures in the West will range from the 70's and 80's in the northern mountains to 115-120 in the lower Southwest deserts. Alaska will be partly to mostly cloudy with scattered showers and thundershowers. High temperatures will be in the 60's and low 70's. Winds will be variable at 10-15 MPH. Northern Minnesota will be sunny with highs in the 80's and south afternoon winds at 10-20 MPH. Warm, dry conditions over a large area of the West will increase the potential for fireactivity. Fire activity is expected to increase due to the upcoming holiday.
