

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
TUESDAY JULY 1, 1997 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Moderate fire activity continued in Alaska and the West. High to extreme fire indices continue to be reported in the southern California, South west, Great Basin and Rocky Mountain Areas.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

MIDWAY, Fairbanks Area Forestry, Alaska State. This highly visible fire is 50 miles southeast of Fairbanks, along the Richardson Highway. Helicopter bucket drops supported crews during line construction. The perimeter paralleling the Richardson Highway has been secured. Fire intensity decreased, with only intermittent torching observed. Hot and dry weather is causing control problems.

RAILROAD #1, Salt Lake District, BLM. This fire is located 40 miles southwest of Salt Lake City, Utah. Minor damage to railroad ties and power poles was reported. Active fire behavior was observed.

OUTLOOK:

A RED FLAG WARNING HAS BEEN POSTED FOR THE NORTHERN HALF OF ARIZONA, INCLUDING THE CENTRAL BASINS AND WHITE MOUNTAINS FOR STRONG WINDS, LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY AND LOW FUEL MOISTURE.

Sunny, hot and dry weather continues in Arizona. Strong and gusty southwest winds of 15 to 35 MPH are possible today. Temperatures will range from the 70's and 80's in the mountains, to the 90's and 100's in the deserts. New Mexico has a slight chance of evening thunderstorms in the southeast portion of the state. Mostly sunny skies and hot temperatures will dominate the remainder of New Mexico. High temperatures will be in the 80's in the mountains and 90 to 105 in the valleys and

deserts. Nevada will be mostly sunny and windy with isolated evening thunderstorms. Southwest winds of 15 to 30 MPH, with gusts to 45 MPH are possible. Northern Nevada will have highs of 75-85; with highs reaching 105 in southern Nevada. A low pressure system over northern California will move eastward today. This will end precipitation over the mountains and increase temperatures. Locally gusty southwest to northwest winds of 15 to 30 MPH are possible. Temperatures will range from the 80's in the mountains to the 100's in the deserts. A high pressure system remains over much of the Alaska interior causing mostly sunny, warm and dry conditions. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's. The southern coast will be mostly cloudy with a chance of rain and temperatures in the lower 60's and 70's.
