

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, OCTOBER 3, 1998 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minimal initial attack activity was reported. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Texas, Oregon, Washington and Montana.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS:

HURRICANE GEORGES: Birch's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center at Roosevelt Roads Naval Base in Puerto Rico. The Team continues to support FEMA efforts on the Island. Power is rapidly being restored to San Juan, while rural communities are expected to be without power for up to two months. The Team has now processed 1.08 million pounds of ice, 820,000 gallons of water, 3,000 cots, 11,000 blankets and 28,000 rolls of plastic, food and building supplies.

Wand's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center in Montgomery, AL. The Team is receiving a steady flow of relief supplies for hurricane victims. Supplies include cots, Meals Ready to Eat (MRE's), blankets, water, ice, generators, toilets and chainsaws. The Center has processed 146 truck loads including 96 generators and 1,003,846 bags of ice.

Bennett's Type I Incident Management Team has been operating a Receiving and Distribution Center at Camp Beauregard in Pineville, LA. The Team is in the process of closing down the center and is scheduled for demobilization tomorrow.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR SOUTHWEST WINDS UP TO 30 MPH.

Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming will be cooler with rain and mountain snow as a strong upper level trough moves across the area. Snow levels will range from 5,000 feet in Washington to 8,000 feet along the southern Idaho border. Winds will be southwest to northwest at 15-30 MPH. High temperatures in the West will range from the 40's in the

northern Rockies, 60's to 70's in California valleys and lower Great Basin, with 80's to lower 90's in the deserts.

West Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will be mostly sunny, with a chance of thunderstorms in Oklahoma. Winds will be southwest at 10-20 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 80's to mid 90's.
