

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 SUNDAY, JUNE 20, 1999 - 0900 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity continued in Alaska and the Southwest. Minimal initial attack activity occurred nationally. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized miscellaneous overhead to the Southwest. Alaska is in the early stages of personnel demobilization. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, West Texas, Southern California, Nevada and Utah.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

DONNELLY FLATS, Fort Greely Army Base. A Type I Incident Management Team (Stam) is assigned. This fire is ten miles south of Ft. Greely, AK. No significant fire activity occurred on the fire yesterday. Crews continued to mop up. Infrared flights found numerous hot spots on the west flank.

MINTO, Tanana Zone BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Cowin) is assigned. This fire is near Minto, AK. Crews are making good progress on fireline construction, focusing on the southwest flank.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRE:

ARRASTA, Yuma Field Office BLM. This fire is five miles northeast of Lake Havasu City, AZ. No other information was received.

MT.EMMA, Grand Canyon NP. A Fire Use Management Team (Zimmerman) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire use module was demobilized yesterday. The transition of the fire to the park will take place this morning. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

OUTLOOK:

Alaska's interior region will be mostly cloudy with scattered showers and areas of rain. High temperatures will be in the 60's to 70's.

Arizona will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms over the higher elevations in the north. The southeast will see scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Temperatures will be 70's and 80's in the mountains and 90's to 110 at the lower elevations.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the upper 60's to lower 80's in the mountains and 80's to the lower 90's at the lower elevations.

Utah will be mostly sunny with isolated afternoon thunderstorms over the mountains. High temperature will range from the 70's and 80's in the mountains to 90's at the lower elevations.
