

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 TUESDAY, OCTOBER 24, 2000 - 0530 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was moderate in northern California and in the Southern Area, and light elsewhere. No new large fires were reported. Crews achieved containment objectives on the large fire in Nevada. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Minnesota.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

HIDDEN, Coast Cascade Region, California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. A State Type I Incident Management Team (Holmes) is assigned. This fire is on Highway 29 near Hidden Valley, CA. One barn, one unoccupied dwelling and two outbuildings have been confirmed destroyed. All existing firelines are holding and crews are making good progress toward containment. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

CARLOS EDGE, Minnesota State Forestry. A State Type II Incident Management Team (Stegmeir) is assigned. This fire is burning in grass, peat and mixed hardwood fuels one mile west of Wyoming, MN. The fire received one-third of an inch of precipitation.

OUTLOOK:

\*\*\* A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN THE FLORIDA PANHANDLE FOR LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY AND STRONG WINDS. \*\*\*

High pressure will build into California as the low pressure system moves northeast. This will bring improving conditions in the south and mostly sunny skies in the northern part of the state. A few showers are possible in the far southeast area. High temperatures will be in the mid 50's to 70's in the mountains and coastal areas, and in the 70's and 80's elsewhere. Minimum afternoon relative humidity will be 20 to 40 percent. Winds will be north at 10 to 15 mph except on the coast where winds will be onshore.

A high pressure system will move into the Great Lakes region bringing clearing skies to Minnesota after some morning fog in the southern part of the state. High temperatures will be in the 60's to lower 70's. Winds will be southeast to southwest at 5 to 15 mph. Minimum relative humidity will range from 40 to 60 percent.
