Ralston, Tahoe NF. IMT 1 (Opliger). Five miles east of Foresthill, CA. Brush and timber. Surface fire with spotting. Structures, fisheries habitat, archaeological sites and watershed threatened.

Bar Complex (4 fires), Shasta-Trinity NF. IMT 1 (Feser). Twelve miles northwest of Weaverville, CA. Timber and brush. Crowning, spotting and backing fire. Structure protection, road closures and evacuations in effect.

Uncles Complex (3 fires), Klamath NF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Kaage) to IMT 2 (Sinclear) today. Eighteen miles northeast of Orleans, CA. Old growth timber and brush. Torching, spotting and flanking. Historical structures and cultural resources threatened.

Happy Camp (two fires), Klamath NF. IMT 2 (Paul). Thirteen miles south of Happy Camp, CA. Timber and brush. Spotting, torching, short runs and backing fire. Campgrounds, cultural sites and watershed threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

Jungle, Gallatin NF. IMT 1 (Stanich). IMT also managing Derby. Twenty miles southeast of Livingston, MT. Timber. Running, long range spotting, crowning, torching. Ranches and Forest Service structures threatened. Evacuations in effect, and structure protection in place.

Derby, Gallatin NF. Fifteen miles south of Big Timber, MT. Timber, grass and heavy dead and down fuels. Creeping, smoldering, backing fire, group torching. Residences, recreation sites and outbuildings threatened. Pre-evacuation warning issued.

Heaven's Gate Complex (four fires), Nez Perce NF. IMT 2 (Grant). Nine miles west of Riggins, ID. Grass and timber. Fire activity reduced from some precipitation. Outbuildings threatened; structure protection in place.

Meadow, Nez Perce NF. IMT 2 (Turman). Fifteen miles southeast of Elk City, ID. Timber. Creeping and smoldering. Closed areas gradually reopening.

Ashley Lake, Flathead Agency BIA. Six miles northeast of St. Ignatius, MT. Timber. Creeping fire.

Hughes 32 Complex (three fires), Idaho Panhandle NF. Ten miles north of Nordman, ID. Cedar, hemlock and subalpine fir. Minimal fire activity. Canadian power line, and a lookout threatened.

Cigarette Rock, Lewis and Clark NF. FUMT (Weldon). FUMT also managing Rival Nanny Complex. Twenty miles southwest of Augusta, MT. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal activity, and area received precipitation. Roads reopened.

Rival Nanny Complex (two fires), Lewis & Clark NF. Twenty-one miles west of Bynum, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior.

Paradise Valley Complex (three fires), Gallatin NF. IMT 2 (Kusicko). Twenty-nine miles southwest of Livingston, MT. Timber. Smoldering. Outbuildings and municipal watershed threatened. Structure protection in place.

Holland Peak, Flathead NF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Heintz) back to local unit today. Five miles east of Condon, MT. Timber. Smoldering, creeping fire.

Sun Dog, Flathead NF. Eighteen miles north of Whitefish, MT. Timber. Smoldering and heavy rain. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

Ulm Peak, Idaho Panhandle NF. Twelve miles southwest of Noxon, MT. Subalpine fir, hemlock and brush. Minimal fire activity and showers.

Revett Complex (three fires), Idaho Panhandle NF. Five miles southeast of Murray, ID. Timber and brush. Isolated torching and creeping.

Ross Complex, Kootenai NF. Fourteen miles southwest of Troy, MT. Subalpine fir, Douglas fir and brush. Minimal activity, and area received precipitation.

Long Canyon Creek, Idaho Panhandle NF. Eighteen miles northwest of Bonners Ferry, ID. Subalpine fir and spruce. Smoldering.

Mink, Clearwater NF. Twenty-five miles east of Lowell, ID. Timber. Minimal activity. This will be the last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

Flick Creek, North Cascades NP. FUMT (Furlong). FUMT also managing Tinpan WFU. One mile east of Stehekin, WA. Mixed conifer. Creeping and smoldering. Community of Stehekin threatened; evacuation notification in effect.

Polallie, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. IMT 2 (Reed). Fifteen miles northwest of Cle Elum, WA. Subalpine fir, lodgepole pine and brush. Creeping and single tree torching. Residences, Forest Service structures and campgrounds threatened. Forest road closures in effect. Decrease in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Tripod Complex (two fires), Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. IMT 1 (Anderson). IMT also managing Cedar Creek, Tatoosh Complex and Van Peak fires. Seven miles northeast of Winthrop, WA. Mixed conifer. Isolated torching, creeping and smoldering.

Elkhorn Complex (three fires), Wallowa-Whitman NF. IMT 2 (Goheen). Sixteen miles northwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and dead and down fuels. Minimal fire behavior. Residences threatened.

Columbia Complex, Southeast, Washington DNR. IMT 2 (Jennings). Fifteen miles northeast of Walla Walla, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Smoldering, creeping and group tree torching. Residences, a ski area and commercial resources threatened.

Twin Lakes Complex (two fires), Wallowa-Whitman NF. IMT 2 (Lunde). Twenty-one miles southeast of Joseph, OR. Timber. Torching. Structures, mine and recreation sites threatened. Evacuation of Cornucopia lifted.

Tinpan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Seven miles west of Lucerne, WA. Timber. Creeping and smoldering.

Puzzle, Willamette NF. Southeast of Idanha, OR. Timber and dead and down fuels. Creeping and smoldering

Cedar Creek, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Eight miles southwest of Mazama, WA. Timber. Isolated torching, creeping and smoldering. Residences and commercial property threatened.

Tatoosh Complex (six fires), Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Twenty-four miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber. Single tree torching, creeping and smoldering. Bridges and Forest Service infrastructure threatened.

Van Peak, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF. Thirty-one miles north of Winthrop, WA. Timber and dead and down fuels. Single tree torching, creeping and smoldering.

Williams Lake Road, Spokane District, BLM. Three miles east of Sprague, WA. Grass, brush and ponderosa pine. Smoldering.

Shake Table Complex, Malheur NF. Nine miles southeast of Dayville, OR. Timber. Smoldering.

Snow, Wasatch Front Area FWS. Ten miles south of Ogden, UT. Timber, sagebrush and grass. Rapid rate of spread, torching and spotting. Structures and watershed threatened. Evacuations in effect. Highway 89 closed.

Rattlesnake Complex (two fires), Boise NF. IMT 1 (Muir). Thirteen miles northeast of Garden Valley, ID. Subalpine fir, pine and grass. Torching, creeping and smoldering. Residences and commercial property threatened.

South Fork Complex (26 fires), Payette NF. FUMT (Reinarz). Thirteen miles east of McCall, ID. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior. Community of Yellow Pine, communications sites and a lookout threatened. Structure protection in place.

Red Mountain, Boise NF. IMT 1 (Broyles). IMT also managing the Boundary Complex. Sixteen miles northeast of Lowman, ID. Subalpine fir and lodgepole pine. Single tree torching, smoldering and creeping. Campgrounds, fisheries habitat and cultural sites threatened.

Boundary Complex (four fires), Salmon-Challis NF. Fourteen miles southeast of Landmark, ID. Timber with heavy dead and down fuels. Single tree torching, smoldering and creeping. Structures and mine sites threatened; structure protection in place.

Middle Fork Complex (thirteen fires), Salmon-Challis NF. IMT 2 (Lund). Thirty miles west of Challis, ID. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior. Structure protection in place for cabin, mine and other facilities.
