**Predictive Services Discussion:**

Dry and windy weather will lead to critical fire weather conditions and moderate to high-risk significant fire potential from southeast Arizona through southern New Mexico. An upper low will slowly move south and east over the Great Lakes, while an associated cold front tracks south and east through the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic today. Dry and breezy post-frontal conditions are likely in portions of Minnesota and possibly into Wisconsin. Showers and thunderstorms will develop across portions of the Great Lakes, with scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms along and ahead of the front from the Northeast into the Southeast and southern Plains. Heavy rain is likely in portions of the eastern Great Lakes, Northeast, and Mid-Atlantic, and severe thunderstorms are likely from the central Gulf Coast through north Texas. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue from the Sierra through much of the central and northern Intermountain West and Rockies. Thunderstorms are likely to move onto portions of the central and southern High Plains as well. Gusty southerly gap winds are likely through the Alaska Range, with scattered showers and below normal temperatures across much of Alaska.
