WHAT?

The national Operational Medical Support Program (OMSP) provides emergency medical services that focus on initial stabilization and extraction of injured employees in the wildland environment.



GOAL

To care for our own anytime, anywhere.

WHO?

BLM employees that are certified as emergency medical responders, emergency medical technicians, and paramedics in either a state or as a national registry of emergency medical technicians.



WHY?

Much of our work is in remote areas under hazardous conditions. Local EMS agencies may be delayed or not able to access our injured personnel in a time sensitive manner. We will provide an additional first line resource for our employees.









WHERE?

The BLM is directly responsible for fire management on more than 245 million acres of public lands, predominantly in the western United States and Alaska. The need for employees with emergency medical certifications extends across the vast lands we manage.
