\* **Railroad**, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles northeast of Palatka, FL. Timber and chaparral. Extreme fire behavior with long-range spotting, short-range spotting and running. Residences and railroad infrastructure threatened. Evacuations in effect.

\* **N Main St 2**, Florida Forest Service. Thirty-six miles north of Ocala, FL. Timber and southern rough. Active fire behavior with short-range spotting, group torching and flanking. Numerous residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

\* **Pineland Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Thirteen miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with long-range spotting, wind-driven runs and group torching. Structures threatened.

**Appalachia**, Cherokee NF, USFS. Eight miles north of Ducktown, TN. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Railroad infrastructure threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

**Conner Nelson Rd 45**, Florida Forest Service. Sixteen miles northwest of Jacksonville, FL. Southern rough and timber. Extreme fire behavior with flanking, long-range spotting and running. Road closures in effect.

**SR 26**, Florida Forest Service. Six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

**STE Alum**, Daniel Boone NF, USFS. Three miles west of Whitley City, KY. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

\* **Sand Beach**, Florida Forest Service. Two miles east of Creel, FL. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping.

**Rosindale Road**, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

\* **Troup Old Potts Road**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Four miles north of West Point, GA. Timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and backing. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Neon White**, Texas A&M Forest Service. Started on private land 17 miles northeast of Spur, TX. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**McGarrh**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Three miles west of Summertown, GA. Timber. No new information.

**139**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. No new information.

**Mill Pond**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. No new information.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Very dry conditions will persist across much of the northern Gulf Coast, Mid-Atlantic, and Southeast, with minimum relative humidity of 10-25%. Locally breezy northwest winds of 10-20 mph with gusts to 30 mph will develop along the east slopes of the Appalachians creating elevated conditions. Very low relative humidity of 5-10% will persist across the Front Range and central High Plains, but with light winds. Southerly return flow will bring increased moisture to the southern High Plains, with humidity remaining above 20%, with isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms developing across the Mogollon Rim and the Gila Mountains in the Southwest. Well above normal temperatures are expected across most of the Intermountain West amid low relative humidity, but winds overall will be light. Showers will move onto the northern California coast overnight ahead of a cold front. A storm will continue to move through the southern half of Alaska with widespread mixed precipitation in the valleys and snow in the mountains as temperatures remain below normal. An increased threat of showers is expected in Hawai'i today, with a few thunderstorms possible for the Big Island.
