PROGNOSIS: A RED FLAG WATCH is in effect in Colorado for dry conditions and warm temperatures. The Rocky Mountain Area has the potential for increasing activity in Colorado, with existing dry conditions and forecast for isolated afternoon thunderstorms. Initial attack activity is expected to continue in the Southwest Area with continuing hot weather and a chance of afternoon thunderstorms. California, Utah and Nevada will have generally sunny skies with temperatures ranging from the 80's in the mountains to 100 in lower elevations.

The Southwest Area anticipates continuing progress on large fires and demobilization of additional resources.

ANALYSIS: Increased activity was experienced in Colorado, the Southwest Area, southern California and Utah.

PROGNOSIS: A very dry airmass will cover California and the Great Basin. Dry lightning is expected to occur on the perimeter of this dry air in eastern Utah, western Colorado, southern Idaho and southwestern Wyoming. An increase in initial attack is anticipated in these areas. Northern California and northwestern Nevada will have shifting, gusty winds, as a Pacific cold front moves into the area. Initial attack activity is expected to decrease in the Southwest Area as monsoonal thunderstorms develop.

Initial attack activity moderated in the Southwest Area due to increased relative humidities and precipitation. An infrared aircraft has been mobilized to the Northwest Territories, Canada.

PROGNOSIS: RED FLAG WARNINGS have been issued for the Great Basin and the central Rocky Mountains for brisk winds and thunderstorms. Increased initial attack activity is anticipated for Utah, western Colorado and southern Wyoming with increasing temperatures and thunderstorms. Scattered mostly wet thunderstorms are forecast for southern Arizona and New Mexico and northern Washington. Resource demobilization from the Southwest Area is anticipated early this week. ^

Temperatures in the 90's with afternoon thunder showers are forecast for North Carolina. Anticipate increased initial attack activity in the Rocky Mountain and Southern Areas.
