Activity is expected to continue due to lightning and the potential from holiday recreational activities throughout the Southwest Area. Increased initial attack is anticipated in southern California as temperatures and winds increase.

PROGNOSIS: High temperatures and afternoon thunderstorms are forecast for Georgia and Florida and will increase initial attack potential. Clear skies and warming temperatures with isolated thunderstorms are forecast across the interior of Alaska, increasing the initial attack activity. Decreasing thunderstorms are expected to minimize initial attack in the Southwest Area.

ANALYSIS: Initial attack activity has increased in the Southern Area. Initial attack activity has decreased in Alaska and the Southwest Area. Initial demobilization planned for several fires on 6/10 and 6/11. No significant acreage gains were reported on large fires in Alaska.

PROGNOSIS: Widely scattered afternoon thunderstorms are forecast for Georgia and Florida. Alaska may experience an increase in initial attack activity due to warmer temperatures and a few thundershowers, mostly in the interior. Decreasing thunderstorms are expected in the Southwest Area.

Alaska will be partly cloudy with widely scattered afternoon showers and thundershowers. The Southwest will experience warmer temperatures with increased winds in Arizona. All three areas can expect increased initial attack efforts.

PROGNOSIS: High temperatures and scattered afternoon thunderstorms are forecast for Florida and southern Georgia. This area should see an increase in initial attack activity due to lightning. Minimal initial attack activity expected in Alaska with rain likely in the northwest, and scattered showers across the central and southern portions of the state. Expect initial attack activity to increase as high pressure builds across the Southwest Area.
