The river levels are predicted to reach 42.5 feet by Saturday.

ANALYSIS: Flooding in the Eastern Area has caused some road closures and evacuations in Illinois. The Southern and Southwest Area experienced minor initial attack activity.

PROGNOSIS: The Southern Area will have scattered showers and thundershowers over the area through Tuesday, returning to mostly dry Wednesday and Thursday with temperatures near to above normal. Fire activity is expected to be minimal through Tuesday, with potential to increase toward the end of the week. The Southwest Area will be mostly warm and dry through next week except for a few showers or thundershowers Monday and Tuesday. Expect fire activity to continue and possibly increase.

ANALYSIS: Initial attack activity continued in the Southern Area and increased in the Eastern Area. The Southwest Area experienced an increase initial attack and large fire activity. The Forest Service sent two fire managers to the Galapagos Islands to assess the fire on Isabela Island. The fire is approximately 136,000 acres and 60% contained. They will evaluate the ecological role of the fire, appropriate suppression response, available personnel and equipment, and any additional needs for suppression.

PROGNOSIS: The Southwest and Southern Areas will experience scattered showers and thundershowers through the middle of next week. This weather pattern is expected to reduce initial attack activity.

Hot and windy weather is causing all Eastern Area fires to be active, with no overnight recovery. Initial attack resources are being stretched thin in the Great Lake states of Minnesota, Wisconsin and Michigan.

PROGNOSIS: *** RED FLAG WARNING FOR WINDS OVER NEW MEXICO *** The Southwest and Southern Areas will experience scattered showers and thundershowers through the middle of next week. This weather pattern is expected to reduce initial attack activity. Weather for the western Great Lakes area will continue to be hot and windy. Initial attack and large fire activity is expected to continue in the Eastern Area.

PROGNOSIS: The northwest portion of the Eastern Area will have a chance of showers Friday and Saturday, then cooling off Sunday. The northern areas of New Mexico and Arizona will be partly cloudy with a few showers Friday and Saturday. The Southern Area will have a chance of showers and thundershowers then cooling Sunday. Some initial attack activity is expected to continue in the Southwest, with minimal activity in the Eastern and Southern Areas.

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
