Current Situation: The Southern Area ordered two type II Helicopters, 1 Air Tanker, 1 Lead Plane, and 1 Infrared Aircraft for the Fish Day fire. Type I Team (Mann), is assigned to the Fish Day fire. The State of North Carolina activated two MAFFS units for the Angola Bay fire. The northern portion of the Eastern Area is experiencing hot and dry conditions. Fire activity in the Southwest has decreased due to widely scattered precipitation. The Southwest has one fire in confinement strategy for 6,350 acres.

Outlook: A RED FLAG WATCH remains in effect for several zones in Florida for low humidities. Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina will be dominated by high pressure with a cold front crossing through later tonight. High fire activity is expected to continue in the Southern Area. The Southwest and southern California will continue to have thunderstorms and scattered showers. The risk associated with the upcoming holiday weekend will increase the potential for human caused fires nationally.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

Current Situation: The Southern Area continued to experience high fire danger and critical conditions in North and South Carolina, Georgia, and Florida. Moderate initial attack activity occurred in North Carolina and Florida in addition to the Fish Day fire which continued to burn in North Carolina.

Southern California experienced initial attack activity resulting in the internal commitment of five type I crews and two airtankers.

The Eastern Area will be releasing the four Northern Rockies crews.

Southern Area - The Fish Day fire on the Croatan Ranger District of National Forests in North Carolina increased in size to an estimated 23,000 acres. The Southern Area Type I Team, Rex Mann, is managing the fire. The acreage increase was the result of a strong unexpected wind event. Requests were received last night for two airtankers, three medium helicopters and several miscellaneous overhead positions. There will be an infrared flight again tonight.

Outlook: A cold front will extend from off the North Carolina coast into Georgia and Florida. Florida, Georgia, and Southeast North Carolina will experience scattered showers and thundershowers. Expected moisture may limit fire activity. High pressure will be centered over Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Michigan bringing clear skies and cool temperatures with Wisconsin and Minnesota being warmer. High pressure will start to rebuild over Arizona and New Mexico with isolated thunderstorms over eastern Arizona and widely scattered over New Mexico, possibly causing a rise in initial attack activity. Southern California will be mostly sunny. Potential for human caused fire activity will increase across the Nation during the upcoming holiday weekend.

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

Current Situation: Large fire suppression continued in the Southern Area while initial attack activity moderated. Good progress was made on large fires in North Carolina. Resource mobilization has stabilized.

Minor initial attack and large fire suppression was reported in Southern California and the Eastern Great Basin.

Fish Day Fire - The fire is located on the Croatan Ranger District near New Bern, North Carolina. Total acreage burned to date is 24,600 with 50% containment. The fire was less active yesterday, receiving up to 1.0 inch of rain, allowing good progress to be made. Extensive utilization of helicopters (22 flight hours) and airtankers (10.8 hours) continued. MAFFS airtankers flew 5.2 hours. The projected size is 30,000 acres with containment estimated on 5/31.

Brown Fire - The fire is 500 acres located on the California Desert District, BLM. Resources mobilized included one caterer, and four airtankers from the Southwest Area. The fire is 30% contained at this time.

Outlook: A stationary front will be over central and northern Florida. A surface high pressure will cover the Carolinas into Virginia bringing sunny and warmer weather from central Georgia north. South Georgia and Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered thundershowers. Partly cloudy and warmer for Arizona and New Mexico with widely scattered thunderstorms. Mostly sunny in southern California.
