Additionally, this system will produce gusty west to northwest winds across the northwest U.S. on Friday. Meanwhile, an upper level low will move from southern California east through Arizona and New Mexico on Friday. This system will produce scattered showers and gusty south winds across eastern Arizona and New Mexico. New fire activity will remain low in all areas. The cold weather in Idaho should put an end to the large fires.
