NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

*** SAFETY COMES FIRST ON EVER FIRE, EVERY TIME. ***

Current Situation: The western U.S. continued to experience initial attack activity. Large fire activity continues to decline across the west. Resource mobilization through NICC remained low. Large fire activity continued in Canada with 56,815 additional acres burned.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

UNION, Phoenix District, BLM. Contained.

BURDETTE, San Carlos Agency, BIA. A Type II Incident Management Team (Moore) is assigned. No new information received.

BASIN/HORSESHOE COMPLEX, Tonto NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Whitney) is committed. Encouraging progress has been made towards containment. Current threats are to riparian and Spotted Owl habitat.

Outlook: An upper level low pressure system along the Idaho/Montana border will move into eastern Montana Thursday afternoon. High pressure will be building along the Pacific coast. A surface cold front will be located from eastern Montana to northwest Arizona during the morning, and extend from western North Dakota to south central Utah by this evening. Scattered showers and thundershowers will extend from Montana, Wyoming and western Colorado to eastern Arizona. Thunderstorms could be strong in the vicinity of this front. Very warm and dry weather conditions will take place well ahead of the front in the plains. Most of the interior west will have highs in the 70's and 80's. Highs will be in the 50's and 60's over the higher terrain of western Wyoming and Montana and up to 110 degrees in the desert Southwest.
