Outlook: A strong upper ridge of high pressure will be centered over the desert Southwest. Meanwhile, a weak upper trough will move into the Pacific Northwest and northern Rockies. Hot, dry weather is forecast for Arizona, Nevada and California. Isolated to widely scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms are expected in southeast Oregon, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, northern Utah, Colorado and northeast New Mexico. Onshore flow in the Pacific Northwest will result in mostly cloudy skies and a few light showers in western Washington and western Oregon. High temperatures will range from

the mid 60's and 70's in western Washington and western Oregon, to 110 and 115 in the desert southwest. Most of the interior west will have highs in the 80's and 90's.
