Current Situation: Three members of the Type 1 Incident Management Short Team (O'Bannon) continue to support the incident in Oklahoma City. Their mission is to support planning functions for emergency medical services, hazardous materials and transportation. Fire activity remained low throughout the U.S.

Outlook: The Southwest Area can expect breezy conditions, especially Tuesday. Highs will be in the 60's for the mountains, 80 to 90 degrees for the deserts. The Southern Area will experience rain across Kentucky into Virginia, with highs 60 to 65 degrees. Florida will be generally dry and warm, with a chance of widely scattered showers and thundershowers. Highs for Florida will be in the upper 80's to low 90's in the south. The Eastern Area will be mostly dry, with a few showers possible in southwest Minnesota Monday. Highs will be from the mid 50's to mid 60's.
