

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 28, 1996 - 0530 MST
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate fire activity continued across the Southern Area. Resource mobilization though NICC remained minimal.

Southern Area Fire Information:

ADA COMPLEX, Muskogee Area Office, Ada Agency, BIA. A Type I Incident Management Team (O'Bannon) is assigned. Initial attack forces responded to a fire near the community of Tupolo. Structures were threatened with no damage reported. Volunteers responded to 5 other fires. All fires reported yesterday were contained. Decreased acreage is due to better mapping.

BLOCK B, Everglades NP. A 300 acre fire started by a catalytic converter is burning near the visitors center at West Royal Palm. The fire continued to burn actively last night in southern rough fuels.

NORTHEAST OKLAHOMA COMPLEX. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kearney) is assigned. The Incident Command Post is fully functional in Tahlequah. The team is awaiting delegation of authority from the state. A plan will be presented to the state this morning, including estimated costs of staging suppression resources. Plans are to respond to an area of approximately 12 million acres.

TEXAS STATE FIRES. A 1,500 acre fire in Jasper County was contained; crews continue to mop up. A portable retardant base is being set up in Waco. No other information available. No new information was received for the fire on Fort Hood Military Reservation.

Due to the number of new fires added to the Ada Complex, the percent contained and containment dates have not been determined.

OUTLOOK: Texas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Arkansas and the Gulf Coast states will be fair except for scattered showers and thundershowers along the coastal areas.

High temperatures will range from the 30's in Oklahoma, north Texas and Missouri to the 70's and 80's in Florida. Winds will be 5-15 MPH, except 15-25 MPH in southern Texas. New Mexico will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of snow showers in the northwest. Highs will range from the 30's and 40's in the mountains to the mid 50's elsewhere. Winds will

range from 5-15 MPH. Moderate fire activity is expected to continue.
