

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SATURDAY, JULY 20, 1996 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Minor initial attack activity continued in most Areas. Eastern Great Basin reported a new large fire. Suppression forces made good progress on several active incidents in the West. Mobilization through NICC was minimal.

Eastern Great Basin Large Fires:

ROSS FORK, Idaho Falls District BLM. The fire is located 9 miles east of Fort Hall, Idaho within the Fort Hall Indian Reservation. Inaccessibility is hindering control efforts; however, retardant drops helped slow the fire spread. Sage Hen habitat is threatened.

EXIT 216, Montana State. The fire is located along Interstate 15 53 miles southwest of Great Falls, MT. High winds were reported yesterday, but no acreage increase occurred.

Rocky Mountain Large Fires:

RAILROAD #2, Wind River Agency, BIA. This fire is burning in the Wind River Canyon, 12 miles south of Thermopolis, WY. Steep terrain and erratic winds prevented crews from constructing fire line. Retardant and water drops were used to protect a threatened microwave site.

Southwest Area Large Fires: Three fires are in a confinement suppression strategy totalling 19,864 acres.

Alaska Large Fires: Twenty-six fires are in a non-suppression status totalling 318,809 acres.

OUTLOOK:

An upper trough over the Northern Rockies will continue to bring dry, breezy conditions, with temperatures in the 70's. Light showers are possible near the Canadian border. High temperatures in the Pacific Northwest will be in the 70's and 80's. Arizona, New Mexico, and Colorado will have isolated thundershowers with temperatures from 80 to 90 degrees in the mountains, rising to 120 degrees in the southwest deserts. The potential for initial attack and large fire activity remains in the western United States.
