

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 THURSDAY, MARCH 7, 1996 - 0530 MST  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Cooler temperatures and higher humidities reduced fire activity through most of the Southern Area yesterday. Resource mobilization remained minimal through NICC.

Southern Area Fire Information:

ADA COMPLEX, Muskogee Area Office, Ada Agency, BIA. A Type I Incident Management Team (O'Bannon) is assigned. Major demob will begin today including the team. A core group of engines, helicopters, dozers and hand crews will remain to supplement local Volunteer Fire Departments. One new fire was reported within the complex yesterday.

NORTHEAST OKLAHOMA COMPLEX. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kearney) is assigned. A cold front over the area brought cooler temperatures and higher humidities dampening fire activity. The town of Cushing had numerous arson fires. The Cushing Fire Department requested a strike team of engines. All fires within the complex are currently contained.

CARD SOUND COMMAND, Florida State. A State Type II Incident Management Team is assigned. Higher humidity and decreased winds lessened fire activity yesterday. Smoke caused visibility problems along Highway 1, closing the road periodically yesterday.

Due to the number of new fires added to the Ada Complex, the percent contained and containment dates have not been determined.

OUTLOOK: Florida will be partly cloudy and breezy with a chance of showers and thunderstorms, mainly in the north. High temperatures will be in the 70's to mid 80's with winds at 15-25 MPH. North Carolina will have strong low pressure moving northeast across the state bringing windy (15-30 MPH) and cooler conditions with showers and thunderstorms. A Flash flood watch is posted for the mountains and foothills. High temperatures will be in the 50's in the mountains to the mid 70's along the coast. Texas, Oklahoma and Arkansas will have strong high pressure dropping across the Plains States bringing dry and cooler weather with north winds at 15-25 MPH. A wind chill advisory is posted for northern Arkansas in the morning. High temperatures will be in the upper 20's in the north to 40's in the south. Fire activity is expected to decrease through most of the Southern Area. Demobilization is anticipated to escalate over the next few days from the Southern Area.
