 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Fire activity has diminished in the Southwest Area. Sixty units in the Southwest reported very high or extreme fire danger, the remainder reported high. Increased fire activity occurred in the Everglades NP in Florida. Resource mobilization remained minimal through NICC.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

HONDO, Carson NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Loving) is assigned. Crews and engines continued to cool hot spots and mop-up along the south and west flanks, especially in the vicinity of subdivisions. Helitankers worked hot spots on the northeast portion. A burnout was completed to contain a small slopover on the western perimeter. The fire burned right up to snow banks above 11,000 feet on the eastern side of the fire.
