CURRENT SITUATION: Fire activity has diminished in the Southwest Area as containment objectives were met on all large fires. Demobilization of resources has begun. Good progress was made on the Everglades NP fires in Florida. Initial attack was minimal in all Areas. Resource mobilization through NICC has decreased.

OUTLOOK: A very strong upper level ridge over Arizona will bring hot and dry conditions to the Southwest and Southern California Areas.
