

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
WEDNESDAY, MAY 15, 1996 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

*** ALL FIREFIGHTERS HAVE THE RIGHT TO A SAFE ASSIGNMENT ***

CURRENT SITUATION: Fire activity continued in Alaska and Southern California. Very high fire indices were reported on some of the southern units in the Eastern Great Basin, Colorado and southern California. Over fifty percent of the reporting units in the Southwest Area experienced very high to extreme fire danger. Mobilization of 16 overhead positions to Alaska occurred through NICC last night.

Alaska Large Fires:

KAZAKOF BAY, Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Wehking) is assigned. Firefighters and dozers completed a line around the fire.

HIDDEN CREEK, Kenai National Wildlife Refuge and Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Dube) is assigned. Burn out operations took place on the west side of the fire from Upper Skilak Road. The fire has burned to the edge of Skilak Lake, but has not reached Upper Skilak campground.

Alaska has 1 fire in confinement/limited strategy for 9,200 acres.

OUTLOOK: *** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR GUSTY SOUTHWEST WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY *** Southern Colorado and New Mexico will be partly cloudy. Southern California and Arizona will be mostly sunny, except for morning fog and low clouds along the southern California coast. High temperatures will range from the 70's to lower 80's in the mountains to near 106 in the lower Arizona deserts. Arizona, northern New Mexico, and southern Colorado will have southwest winds from 15 to 30 MPH. Southern Alaska will be sunny, dry and breezy with high temperatures in the 60's. The Matsu Valley, Copper River Basin and the Kenai Peninsula will have north winds at 10 to 15 MPH.
