

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 THURSDAY, MAY 16, 1996 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

*** SAFETY COMES FIRST ON EVERY FIRE, EVERY TIME ***

CURRENT SITUATION: All large fires in southern California have been contained. Very high fire indices were reported in southern Utah, Colorado, southern California and on the Huron NF in Michigan. More than ninety percent of the reporting units in the Southwest Area continue to experience very high or extreme fire danger. Resource mobilization through NICC was minimal yesterday.

Alaska Large Fires:

HIDDEN CREEK, Kenai National Wildlife Refuge and Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Dube) is assigned. The fire made a 1,000 acre run along Skilak Lake. The Upper Skilak Lake campground was secured. Burnout operations along Upper Skilak Lake campground road were completed.

PRATOR LAKE, Alaska State. The fire necessitated the evacuation of 20-25 homes in a subdivision in Houston, AK on the evening of 5/14. Two homes and several outbuildings were destroyed. Volunteer Fire Department engines assisted by providing structure protection. Residents were allowed to return to their homes late on 5/14. Containment was expected last night.

Alaska has 1 fire in confinement/limited strategy for 9,200 acres.

OUTLOOK: *** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR GUSTY SOUTHWEST WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY *** Southern Colorado and northern Arizona will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Southern Arizona and New Mexico will be mostly sunny and breezy. High temperatures will range from the 60's and 70's in the mountains to near 100 in the southern deserts. Winds will be from the southwest at 15-30 MPH with gusts to 40 MPH in northern Arizona. Southern California will be mostly cloudy and cooler with higher humidities and a chance of showers. The mountains and deserts will have southwest winds at 20-40 MPH. High temperatures will range from the 50's to 60's in the mountains to near 90 in the lower deserts. Central Florida will be partly cloudy with high temperatures in the mid 80's and minimum relative humidity at 45%. Southern Alaska will be mostly sunny with gusty north winds and high temperatures near 60.
