 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Large fire activity continued in the Rocky Mountain and Southwest Areas. The Eastern Area experienced increased fire activity. High to extreme fire danger remains throughout the southwestern United States. Resource mobilization through NICC was steady to the Rocky Mountain Area.

Rocky Mountain Area Large Fires:

BUFFALO CREEK, Pike/San Isabel National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Birch) is assigned. There was little fire growth yesterday due to decreased winds and higher humidities. Two homes and 10 outbuildings were destroyed on the 18th. Many structures remain threatened. A structure protection plan is in effect and evacuation plans are being developed.

CRYSTAL, Arapaho/Roosevelt National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Krugman) is assigned. An escaped campfire caused the fire. Lower temperatures and higher humidities allowed suppression forces to make good progress.

Southwest Area Large Fires:

HORSESHOE, Coconino National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bedlion) is committed. High winds caused the fire to run in Pinyon Juniper. Winds hampered holding efforts, grounding aircraft late yesterday morning. The fire is threatening private land and seven scattered residences have been evacuated. Structure protection is in place. Good progress was made on the west side of Highway 180.

OUTLOOK: Arizona and New Mexico will be mostly sunny and warm with 15 to 30 MPH northerly afternoon winds. High temperatures will range from the 70's in the mountains to 105 in the southern deserts. Southern California will be mostly sunny with west to northwest winds at 15 to 25 MPH, gusting to 35 MPH in the deserts. High temperatures will range from the 60's on the coast to the 80's in the valleys. Colorado will be partly cloudy with widely scattered showers and thunderstorms. Temperatures will range from the 50's and 60's in the mountains to near 85 in the east. Winds will be northwest at 10 to 15 MPH. Florida will have increasing clouds with scattered afternoon thunderstorms with heavy rain possible in southern Florida and the keys. High temperatures will be in the upper 80's to near 90 with variable 5 to 10 MPH winds. Upper Michigan will be mostly cloudy with a good chance of showers or thunderstorms. High temperatures will be near 70 with west winds at 15 to 20 MPH. Initial attack and large fire activity is expected to continue in the southwestern U.S.
