

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 1996 - 1000 MST
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: The Southern Area continued to experience moderate initial attack fire activity this past week. One large fire occurred in southern California last weekend. No other significant fire activity was reported.

Southern California Large Fires:

WIND, Cleveland NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Cooney) was assigned to this fire. The fire was 50 miles east of San Diego in the Pine Creek Wilderness. The fire was contained on 11/12.

OUTLOOK: High pressure over the Ohio Valley will result in cool and dry weather over the southeast United States through the weekend. Windy conditions are forecast through the weekend in Florida with rain showers along the Atlantic coast. The weather will turn warmer with a chance of rain early next week. High temperatures will range from the 50's in the mountains to the low 80's in south Florida. Temperatures will moderate with lighter winds mid-week. A series of storms are forecast in the Western United States this next week. This will bring cool and locally windy conditions to southern California and Arizona. Showers will continue in the mountains over the weekend with dry weather developing early next week. High temperatures in southern California and Arizona will range from the upper 50's and 60's in the mountains to the 70's along the coast and upper 80's in the deserts.
