NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: A new large fire was reported in the Western Great Basin Area. Minimal fire activity occurred throughout the remainder of the United States.

Western Great Basin Large Fires:

MUD, Battle Mountain District, BLM. The fire is burning in light grass and sage 60 miles northwest of Eureka, NV. The fire remained active throughout the night. Air support aided firefighters in line construction yesterday. Steep terrain and inaccessibility have hindered suppression efforts.

Two fires are in a confine and contain suppression strategy for 27,740 acres.

Fifty-six fires are in a confine and contain suppression strategy for 57,900 acres.

Three fires are in a confine and contain suppression strategy for 23,840 acres.

Alaska Large Fires:

Six fires are in a limited protection status totalling 84,512 acres.

OUTLOOK:

An upper level ridge of high pressure will build over southern California

and the desert Southwest. A strong west to northwesterly flow of air will cover the remainder of the west. A cold front will develop over the Pacific Northwest bringing light rain into western Washington and northwest Oregon. Eastern Washington and Montana will receive widely scattered showers. Southern California to the southern Rockies will be dry and slightly warmer. High temperatures will range from the 50's and 60's in Washington and Montana to the 90's in the Southwest deserts. Most other areas will experience high temperatures in the 70's and 80's.
