

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY AUGUST 25, 1997 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Large fire activity continued in the Northwest Area. The Eastern Great Basin Area reported one new large fire. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in California, Utah, Nevada and Oregon.

NORTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

MANN LAKE, Burns District, BLM. This fire is located 36 miles north of Fields, OR. Firefighters have made good progress toward containment objectives. Structure protection was established for ranch buildings in the vicinity of the fire.

COTTONWOOD CREEK, Burns District, BLM. This fire is located 30 miles north of Fields, OR. Cooler temperatures and higher relative humidities have assisted suppression efforts. Limited access has created control problems.

PERRY ROAD, Washington State. This fire is located 12 miles north of Spokane, WA. No new information was provided. This will be the last report unless new information is reported.

PINE PARK, Cedar City District, BLM. This fire is located 30 miles northwest of St. George, UT. Limited access and windy conditions have hindered suppression efforts.

The Eastern Basin Area has 1 other large fire burning for a total of 1,500 acres.

OUTLOOK:

Washington and Oregon will be mostly cloudy in the west with scattered showers.

The eastern portions of these states will be partly cloudy with a chance of showers. High temperatures will range from the 60's along the coast to the 80's inland.

California will be mostly sunny with patchy fog and low clouds along the coast.

High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's along the coast, the 70's and 80's in the mountains, the 80's and 90's in the valleys, and up to 100 in the deserts.

Utah and Nevada will be partly cloudy and breezy with scattered mountain thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the mountains, and the upper 80's and 90's in the valleys.

Idaho will be mostly sunny and warmer. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's across the state.

Montana will be mostly sunny with decreased winds. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's.
