

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 THURSDAY AUGUST 28, 1997 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Increased large fire activity was reported in the Northwest Area. Containment objectives were achieved on the large fire in the Eastern Basin Area. Minimal initial attack activity was reported elsewhere. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in California, Nevada, Idaho, Washington and Oregon.

NORTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

OLYMPIA COMMAND, Department of Natural Resources, Washington State. This fire is located near Kennewick, WA. Decreased winds have allowed firefighters to make good progress on line construction. Fifty homes in the vicinity of the fire are threatened, but none have been damaged or destroyed. Containment was anticipated last night.

OUTLOOK:

Washington and Oregon will be mostly cloudy with scattered showers west of the Cascade mountains. Partly cloudy conditions with scattered showers and thunderstorms are forecast east of the Cascades this afternoon. Temperatures will be 65 to 75 in the west and 75 to 85 in the east.

Northern California will have a slight chance of showers near in the far north.

Morning fog and low clouds along the northern coast will dissipate and become partly sunny by afternoon. Mostly sunny conditions are predicted over the interior northern mountains and valleys. Southern California will have sections of low clouds and patchy fog along the immediate coastal areas. The remainder of the south will be mostly sunny with locally breezy conditions in the deserts. California temperatures will range from the 70's along the coast to 110 in the deserts.

Most of Nevada and Utah will be sunny. Southern and eastern Utah and southern Nevada will be partly cloudy. A chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms with areas of locally heavy rain is possible in eastern Utah. Locally breezy conditions are forecast over the southern Nevada and Utah deserts. Temperatures will range from the 80's in the north to 110 in the southern deserts and plateaus.

Idaho will be mostly cloudy with a chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms in the north and central mountains. Partly cloudy conditions are predicted in the southwest, with mostly sunny skies in the southeast. Northern temperatures will be in the 70's with southern and central highs reaching the 80's.

Montana will be mostly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms west of the Continental Divide. Partly cloudy skies with scattered showers and thunderstorms are predicted in the east. Temperatures will range from 65 in the west 90 in the east.
