

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 THURSDAY JULY 3, 1997 - 0530 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Increased fire activity was reported in the Rocky Mountain, Southern California and Alaska Areas. NICC processed orders for helicopters, crews, equipment and miscellaneous overhead in support of the new fires. Minimal fire activity was reported for remainder of the U. S. Fire indices remain high to extreme throughout the southern half of the western U.S.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

CANYON 2, Angeles NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bacon) is assigned. This fire is north of Azusa, CA along Highway 39. Structure protection has been established for homes in the area. The main power supply to San Gabriel Canyon has been severed due to damaged power poles. Steep, rugged terrain continues to hinder containment objectives.

DEL DIOS, Monte Vista Ranger Unit, California State. This fire is located south of the Del Rios Highway. Active fire behavior was observed yesterday. Current threats include structures to the south of the fire.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN LARGE FIRES:

SEWEMUP, Grand Junction District, BLM. Strong winds and low relative humidity are causing extreme fire behavior. Containment lines on the eastern perimeter were challenged by wind driven flames. Severe burning conditions are hampering containment efforts.

OUTLOOK: California will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will range from the 70's in the mountains to the 90's in the deserts. Alaska will be cooler in the northern and central portions with scattered showers and thunderstorms. Mostly sunny skies and widely scattered thunderstorms are forecast for southern Alaska. Temperatures will range from the 70's in the north to the 80's in the south. Nevada will have sunshine and clear skies. The northern portion of the state will have highs in the 80's. Desert temperatures will reach the 100's. Sunny and hot conditions with isolated thunderstorms are forecast for New Mexico. Arizona will be mostly sunny with decreasing winds. Mountain temperatures in the Southwest Area will be in the 80's and 90's with desert temperatures climbing to the 100's.
