

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
TUESDAY JULY 15, 1997 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Initial attack fire activity increased in southern California. Fire activity remained minimal in most other Geographic Areas. New large fires were reported in the Northwest and Southern Areas. Firefighters are making good progress on large fires in Alaska. High to extreme fire dangers continue to dominate the western United States.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

INOWAK, Southwest Area Forestry, Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kechter) is assigned. The fire advanced an additional 2.5 miles to the south in the area between Inowak and Moose Creek. Moderate fire behavior occurred in the area closest to Stony River where the fire remains 2 miles away. The fire is spreading at four chains per hour toward the southeast, with four foot flame lengths along a four mile front. Dry, windy conditions are forecast for the next several days.

CAMP LAKE, Tok Area Forestry, Alaska State. This fire is between Tok and North way. The fire size has not increased due to rainy weather. Crews continue to concentrate efforts on the south and east flanks. Some demobilization is occurring.

BUTTE CREEK, Fairbanks Area Forestry, Alaska State. The fire was demobilized on 7/13. Pumps and hose remain in place in case cabin protection be required. Th is will be the last report, unless significant activity occurs.

OUTLOOK:

Alaska will be mostly cloudy with light rain in the southern portion. The interior will be partly cloudy in the west, with isolated afternoon thunderstorms in the east. The west coast will be mostly cloudy. Temperatures will range from the 50's along the coast to the 70's in the interior.

California will be sunny and hot. The coastal areas will be cooler with patchy fog and low clouds reaching into the valleys. Partly cloudy skies and a slight chance of afternoon thunderstorms are forecast for the Sierra Nevada and southern mountains. Temperatures will be in the 60's along the coast, the 70's and 80's in the mountains, and the 90's and 100's in the valleys and deserts.

Nevada will be sunny and warm with a slight chance of thunderstorms over the eastern and central mountains. High temperatures will be in the 90's and low 100's throughout the state.

Partly sunny conditions are forecast for Colorado. Isolated thunderstorms are possible in the mountains. Temperatures will range from the 70's in the mountains to the 90's and 100's elsewhere.

The Southwest Area will be sunny and hot with a slight chance of afternoon thunderstorms. The risk of thunderstorms is slightly greater in central and southeastern Arizona. Temperatures will range from the 80's and 90's in the mountains to 118 in the deserts of Arizona.
