

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
TUESDAY, JULY 22, 1997 - 0530 MDT  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Fire activity increased in Alaska, the Northwest and Great Basin. New large fires were reported in Texas, Utah, New Mexico and northern California. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed resource orders for three Type I crews and miscellaneous overhead for Alaska. Fire danger ranges from high to extreme for numerous units throughout the western United States, Texas and New Jersey.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

INOWAK, Southwest Area Forestry, Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kechter) is assigned. Fire behavior significantly increased when the inversion lifted yesterday. Firefighters observed 40 to 50 foot flame lengths and spotting up to 1,000 feet ahead of the fire. Additional personnel and cargo were delivered to Red Devil as travel conditions improved.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

PAHCOON, Cedar City District, BLM. This fire is located 15 miles northwest of St. George, UT. Suppression efforts are being hampered by extremely dry fuels, high temperatures, and gusty winds.

BUCKSKIN, Cedar City District, BLM. Containment was expected last night. No other information was available.

# OUTLOOK:

\*\*\* A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR \*\*\*  
 \*\*\* CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN NEVADA FOR DRY THUNDERSTORMS \*\*\*

Alaska will have scattered showers and wet thunderstorms in the central and northern regions. Rain showers are likely in the south. Temperatures will range from the 50's and 60's along the coast to the 70's in the interior.

Utah will be mostly cloudy with scattered afternoon showers and thunderstorms in the north. Southern Utah will have numerous showers and thunderstorms. Temperatures across the state will be in the mid 80's and 90's.

Nevada will have mostly cloudy skies with scattered afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Northern temperatures will be in the mid 80's and 90's. Southern highs will range from the 80's to near 102.

Arizona and New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Temperatures will reach the 70's and 80's in the mountains and the 90's to 105 in the valleys and Arizona deserts.

Scattered showers and wet thunderstorms are forecast for California, especially in the mountains. Coastal temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's. Mountain temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's, with valley and desert highs reaching the 90's and low 100's.

Partly cloudy skies with afternoon showers and thunderstorms will dominate Colorado. Temperatures will range from the 70's in the mountains to the 80's and 90's elsewhere.
