

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, MAY 30, 1997 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Minor initial attack activity was reported nationally. High to extreme fire danger continues to be reported in southern California and the Southwest.

OUTLOOK: Southern California will be mostly sunny and dry. Northern California will be partly cloudy with isolated thunderstorms near the Oregon border. Fog is expected near the coast. High temperatures will range from the 70's on the coast to the low 100's in the southern deserts. Arizona and southern Nevada will be sunny, hot and very dry with temperatures from the 70's in the mountains to 110 in the deserts. New Mexico will be sunny with warmer and drier conditions in the southwest. The north and east portion of the state will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. High temperatures across the state will range from the 70's in the mountains to the mid 90's. Southern Colorado will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon and evening thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's.
