

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 26, 1997 - 1000 MST
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION: Moderate initial attack activity was reported in the Southern Area.

OUTLOOK: Southern Florida will be mostly sunny and dry through Friday, turning cloudy with a chance of showers on Saturday through next week. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's. Coastal South Carolina will be mostly sunny and cool, turning cloudy on Sunday with a chance of rain through next week. High temperatures will be in the 50's and 60's.

Southern California will be breezy with showers possible and snow showers in the higher elevations today and Thursday. Friday through Sunday will be warmer and drier. Cooler temperatures, cloudy skies with a chance of mountain snow and valley rain will return Monday through Thursday. High temperatures will be in the 50's and 60's, reaching the 70's over the weekend. Mountain temperatures will be in the 30's and 40's.
