

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, AUGUST 7, 1998 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Increased initial attack fire activity occurred in the Eastern Great Basin. Moderate initial attack activity was reported elsewhere. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for crews, helicopters, equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Equipment, a Type I Crew and five smoke chaser modules are being mobilized to British Columbia, Canada today. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Florida, Georgia, Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Washington, Oregon and California.

NORTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

NORTH 25, Wenatchee NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Furlong) is assigned. This fire is located 35 miles northwest of Chelan. Over 100,000 gallons of retardant were dropped on the fire yesterday. Burn-out on the east flank was successful, which kept the fire from infringing on any residences.

SCROGGIE Spokane District BLM. This fire is located in Lincoln County. One injury occurred on the fire due to heat exhaustion. Two archeological sites have been destroyed.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

437, Texas State - Anderson County. This fire is burning along State Highway 294, near Denson Springs. Extreme fire behavior was reported with rapid rates of spread and 50 foot flame lengths in the plantation. Thirty to thirty-five homes are threatened and at least nine homes were evacuated. Some resources were placed in safety zones for a short time.

SOUTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

SYCAMORE, Coconino NF. This fire is located 25 miles southeast of Flagstaff. Good progress was made on line construction due to cooler temperatures. Disturbance of the Spotted Owl habitat is considered moderate. Full containment was expected last night.

NORTH RIM COMPLEX, Grand Canyon NP. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kleindienst) is assigned. This fire is located 80 miles northwest of Flagstaff. No new information was received.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR WESTERN UTAH AND EASTERN NEVADA FOR DRY LIGHTNING WITH GUSTY THUNDERSTORM WINDS. The Western U.S. will be very hot and dry with scattered thunderstorms across Nevada, Utah, Colorado, New Mexico and Arizona. The Pacific Northwest will be cooler with higher humidities. High temperatures will be in the 80's to mid 90's in the mountains and upper 90's to 118 in the valleys and deserts.

Texas will be mostly cloudy and hot with scattered thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's to 102.

Oklahoma and Arkansas will be partly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's to mid 90's.

Michigan will be mostly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the mid 70's to lower 80's.
