

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY, AUGUST 10, 1998 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity was reported from all Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a shower, crews, helicopters, equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Five Type II crews are being mobilized to Canada today. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Washington, Oregon and California.

NORTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

NORTH 25, Wenatchee NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Furlong) is assigned. This fire is located 35 miles northwest of Chelan. Burn out operations and structure protection continued yesterday. Unburned islands within the perimeter continue to burn.

BUTTE, Prineville District BLM. This fire is located 35 miles east of Madras. The fire is burning in two directions. The north end is being worked with air tankers to protect structures. The south end is burning in lighter fuels away from a ranch. Roads and an old burn in the area are assisting in control efforts. Good progress was made on the fire yesterday.

SKULL CREEK, Burns District BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Solarz) is assigned. This fire is located north of Fields. Poor access, heavy continuous fuel loading, very low relative humidity recovery and gusty winds are hampering control efforts. Big game winter range, threatened and endangered fisheries habitat, private structures and power lines are all at risk.

COPPER CREEK, Helena NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bullis/Suenram) is assigned. This fire is approximately 45 miles northwest of Helena. No new information was reported.

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EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRE:

GOOSEBERRY COMPLEX, Boise NF. This fire is located 45 miles northeast of Boise. This complex consists of 20 fires and is being managed by a local Type III Incident Management Team. Significant progress was made on all the fires in the complex. No night shift is scheduled and demobilization has begun.

MAIN SALMON COMPLEX, Salmon-Challis NF. This complex is located 40 miles west northwest of Salmon. A Interagency Fire Use Management Team (Clark) is assigned to this dual Geographic Area complex. The complex consists of seven fires burning on the Salmon-Challis, Payette, Nez Perce and Bitterroot National Forests.

NORTH RIM COMPLEX, Grand Canyon NP. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kleindienst) is assigned. This fire is located 80 miles northwest of Flagstaff. Objectives for this fire have been met. The Type II Incident Management Team and crews will be demobilized today. Strategies to keep smoke emissions within acceptable limits over the next two to three months have been developed. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR GUSTY WINDS IN EASTERN WASHINGTON, INCLUDING THE EAST SLOPES OF THE CASCADES. Washington, Oregon, California and Nevada will be mostly sunny with isolated to scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Eastern Nevada and Wyoming will have partly cloudy skies. Utah, Colorado, Arizona and New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered locally wet afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the upper 60's to 70's in the mountains and 80's to 105 in the valleys and deserts.

Texas and Oklahoma will be mostly sunny with continued hot conditions. The most western, southern and eastern portions of Texas, along with eastern Oklahoma, will be partly cloudy with isolated wet afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's in the west Texas mountains and from 95 to 105 elsewhere.

Arkansas will be partly cloudy with isolated to scattered mainly wet afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 90's.
