

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, AUGUST 15, 1998 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack fire activity continues in most Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a lead plane, helicopters, caterer, shower, crews and miscellaneous overhead. Infrared aircraft flew fires in the Northwest and Northern Rockies. Very high to extreme indices were reported in Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Minnesota, South Dakota, Arizona, Montana, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Washington, Oregon and California.

NORTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

GORGE, Winema NF. A Type II Incident management Team (Gardner) is assigned. This fire is located 9 miles east of Oakridge, OR. It is burning in an area designated as a Wild and Scenic River and is a source of water for the city of Westfir. Terrain adjacent to the river is very steep and rocky.

NORTH 25, Wenatchee NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Furlong) is assigned. This fire is located 27 miles northwest of Chelan. No new information was reported.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

KEYSTONE, Winnemucca District BLM. This fire is located at the Mill City exit off I-80. Winds were favorable to accomplish a burn out operation from the Tungston Mine.

SPALDING, WINNEMUCCA District BLM. This fire is location 20 miles south of Winnemucca, NV. Thunderstorms in the area caused control problems.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

GOOSE CREEK, Sawtooth NF. This fire is located 26 miles south of Burley. Limited interior flare-up with a few hot spots occurred yesterday.

JACKASS, Salmon-Challis NF. This fire is 30 miles southwest of Salmon. The north side of the fire had moderate activity in the late afternoon.

MAIN SALMON COMPLEX, Salmon-Challis NF. This complex is located 40 miles west northwest of Salmon. An Interagency Fire Use Management Team (O'Brien) is assigned. The complex consists of eleven fires burning in the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness on the Salmon-Challis, Payette, Nez Perce and Bitterroot National Forests. The Rainer and Lantz fires burned together and are being reported under the Rainer fire. One new fire, Bear Point was added to the complex. Fire activity occurred on the Rainer, Bend Creek, Hamilton, Arctic, Upper Phantom and Cayuse fires, while minimal activity occurred on the others. Two ground monitors were assigned to the Rainer fire. The Magruder Road was closed between Observation Point and Dry Saddle due to activity on Bend Creek fire.

COLD SPRINGS, Salmon-Challis NF. The fire backed down a northerly exposure increasing the total acreage. No problems at this time.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR EASTERN WASHINGTON AND THE NORTHERN PORTIONS OF EASTERN OREGON FOR STRONG WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITIES. A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR WESTERN AND SOUTH-CENTRAL UTAH FOR DRY LIGHTNING AND GUSTY WINDS WITH THE PASSING THUNDERSTORMS.

In the western U.S., scattered thunderstorms most numerous over Arizona and New Mexico. Cooler and breezy for the Pacific northwest and northern Rockies. Dry thunderstorms with gusty winds are possible in eastern Nevada and Utah. High temperatures will range from the upper 70's to near 90 in the mountains and from 90 to 113 in the valleys and deserts.

Arkansas and Oklahoma will be partly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will range from the mid 80's to mid 90's.

Texas will be partly cloudy and hot with a chance of thunderstorms. High temperatures will range from 90 to 105.
