

## INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT

WEDNESDAY, JULY 15, 1998 - 0530 MDT

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

### CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity continued in the Southern and Eastern Great Basin Areas. Resource mobilization through the National Interagency Coordination Center was minimal. Demobilization from fires in Florida is continuing. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Florida, Georgia, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Colorado, Utah, Nevada, California and Washington.

### SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FLAGLER/ST. JOHNS COMPLEX, Florida State, Flagler and St. Johns Counties. A Type I Incident Management Team (Loving) is assigned. Unburned interior islands continue to smolder as mop up continues.

JACKSONVILLE II COMPLEX, Florida State, Nassau, Duval and Clay Counties. A Type I Incident Management Team (Monahan) is assigned. Fire management is under Unified Command with Florida State (Caulliette). Rain has been spotty, but high relative humidities have aided mop-up efforts.

SUWANNEE OAK COMPLEX, Florida State, Columbia, Union, Bradford and Baker Counties. A Type I Incident Management Team (Dague) is assigned. Unified command is in effect with Florida State (Crow). Scattered thunderstorms over the complex brought very limited rain yesterday. Rehabilitation of tractor and dozer lines and mop-up operations are continuing.

HONEY SCRUB COMPLEX, Okefenokee NWR. This fire is burning in dry scrub and grass in the Okefenokee Refuge. A Type I Incident Management Team (Dubois) is assigned. The Honey Scrub Complex is managing all other fires within the refuge, including the Billys East, S3 and Honey Scrub fires. Rain, heavy at times, fell throughout the day. The Incident Management Team will present a range of suppression options to Refuge managers today. Stephen C. Foster will remain closed until further notice. Boat trails on the east side of the refuge will be reopened on a limited basis. The acreage has been adjusted after remapping.

ROCK CANYON, Texas State, Borden County. This fire started three days ago, but was just turned over to the West Texas Suppression Zone. No other information was reported.

BARN, Cedar City BLM. This fire is burning in Pinon-Juniper, sage and grass thirty-six miles southwest of Cedar City. Good progress was made in securing the line on all fronts utilizing an airtanker, helicopters and burnout operations.
