

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT

THURSDAY, JULY 16, 1998 - 0530 MDT

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

CURRENT SITUATION:

Good progress continues on the large fires in Florida as precipitation on several of the complexes aid suppression efforts. Resource mobilization through the National Interagency Coordination Center remained minimal. Demobilization from fires in Florida is continuing. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Florida, Georgia, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Colorado, Utah, Nevada, California and Washington.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

JACKSONVILLE II COMPLEX, Florida State - Nassau, Duval and Clay Counties. A Type I Incident Management Team (Monahan) is assigned. Fire management is under Unified Command with Florida State (Caulliette). Carr's Type II Incident Management Team will begin transition today. Portions of the complex received locally heavy rainfall. Mop-up continues on three fires.

SUWANNEE OAK COMPLEX, Florida State - Columbia, Union, Bradford and Baker Counties. A Type I Incident Management Team (Dague) is assigned. Unified command is in effect with Florida State (Crow). Crews are rehabilitating fire line in the wilderness and providing initial attack support. Transition of the complex back to the Division of Forestry will begin today. Excess resources are being released.

HONEY SCRUB COMPLEX, Okefenokee NWR. This fire is burning in dry scrub and grass in the Okefenokee Refuge. A Type I Incident Management Team (Dubois) is assigned. The incident fire behavior analyst reported observing open flames following the rainstorm. An infrared flight has been ordered to determine the extent of the fire in swamp muck. The fire has burned underground and can resurface and cause control problems with a few days of sunshine.

OUTLOOK:

Florida and southern Georgia will be partly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the upper 80's to lower 90's.

Southern Nevada, Utah and Arizona will be sunny, very hot and dry. The eastern Arizona mountains will have isolated afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will range from the 80's in the mountains to 120 in the valleys and deserts.

New Mexico and western Texas will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's in the mountains to 105 in the lower elevations.
