

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT

TUESDAY, JULY 28, 1998 - 0530 MDT

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Increased initial attack fire activity occurred in the Northwest, Eastern Great Basin, California and Southern Areas. Two Type II Incident Management Teams were committed internally to fires less than 100 acres in the Northwest Area yesterday, one to the Wenatchee NF and one to the Mt Baker-Snoqualmie NF. Another Type II Incident Management Team will be mobilized this morning to manage numerous lightning fires on the Colville BIA. Fire activity across the remainder of the nation was moderate. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for caterers, a shower, overhead, helicopters, equipment and engines. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Georgia, Texas, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, California and Washington.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

GREENVILLE, Texas State - Hunt County. Thirty six homes in the area have been evacuated and several homes were reported lost. Temperatures in the low hundreds and KBDI indices of 600 are causing control problems. No other information was available.

LIVE OAK, Texas State - Hill County. Heavy fuel loadings are hindering suppression efforts. The fire was caused by arson, and a suspect is in custody. There are forty homes within a mile radius of the fire. One mobile home has been lost.

SIXMILE CREEK, Texas State - Sabine County. The fire is burning in timber and a plantation. Commercial timber is currently threatened. No other information was received.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR DRY LIGHTNING IN EASTERN WASHINGTON. The Western U.S. will be partly cloudy and seasonable hot. There will be scattered wet thunderstorms in the Rocky Mountains and isolated thunderstorms in the Great Basin and Northwest. Afternoon temperatures will continue to be hot with highs ranging from the 80's to mid 90's in the mountains and from the mid 90's to 115 in the valleys and deserts.

Texas will be mostly sunny and hot with high temperatures in the 90's to 105.

Oklahoma and Arkansas will be partly cloudy, hot and humid with scattered thunderstorms. Winds will be variable at 10 to 15 MPH. High temperatures will range from the mid 90's to 105.

Michigan will be partly sunny with a slight chance of showers. Winds will be from the southwest at 10 to 20 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 80's to low 90's.
