

## INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT

MONDAY, JUNE 29, 1998 - 0530 MDT

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

### CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity increased in the Southwest, Rocky Mountain and Southern Areas necessitating the mobilization of Incident Management Teams. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a Type I Incident Management Team, equipment, aircraft, crews, and miscellaneous overhead for these Areas. Minimal initial attack activity was reported in most other Areas. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Florida, Georgia, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Colorado, Utah, California and Nevada.

### SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

**BUNNELL-VOLUSIA COMPLEX**, Florida State, Volusia County. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kearney) is assigned. The Bunnell Complex has been separated into two complexes. Volusia County has banned all fireworks and shows have been canceled in several cities in the area. A local state of emergency has been declared. Voluntary evacuations are still in effect for Pierson, Florida. Smokey conditions have caused many road closures throughout the County.

**BUNNELL COMPLEX**, Florida State, Flagler and St. Johns Counties. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hendricks) is assigned. These fires are on the north side of Highway 40. Thunderstorm activity in the vicinity has ignited 36 new fires in the past two days.

**OAK HEAD COMPLEX**, Osceola National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Greenhoe) is assigned. These fires are 20 miles north of Lake City. Fire activity has gradually increased as warm and dry conditions persist. Firefighters continue to make good progress with mop-up.

**PERRY COMPLEX**, Florida State, Taylor, Dixie, Lafayette and Madison Counties. A Type II Incident Management Team (Pearson) is assigned. Heavy fuels, organic soils and dry conditions have caused control problems. Current concerns are for a pine plantation in the area.

**SUWANNEE COMPLEX**, Florida State, Columbia, Union, Bradford and Baker Counties. A Type I Incident Management Team (Wands) is assigned. A Unified

Command is in effect. Firefighters are nearing containment objectives. Mop-up operations continue.

ORLANDO COMPLEX, Florida State. A Type I Incident Management Team (Birch) is assigned. No other information was available.

#### SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

OSA, Santa Fe NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Bateman) is assigned. This fire is 10 miles north of Los Alamos. Two small fires burned together and made a significant run yesterday. No other information was available.

LEGGETT, Gila NF. This fire is 8 miles west of Reserve. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bustamonte) is assigned. Containment lines are established, but due to extreme weather conditions containment has not been declared.

RIM TANK, Coronado NF. This fire is 45 miles northeast of Tucson. No new information was provided.

#### ROCKY MOUNTAIN LARGE FIRES:

BEAR TRACK, Arapaho-Roosevelt NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Sexton) has been ordered. This fire is burning in a heavy concentration of bug infested timber 10 miles west of Evergreen. Airtankers and crews focused primarily on the east flank to minimize the risk to private property. Their efforts were successful and the fire is moving toward the Wilderness area around Mount Evans. Hot and dry conditions have caused active fire behavior.

#### EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

BULLDOG, Cedar City District, BLM. This fire is 25 miles southwest of St. George. The fire has burned into Arizona. Extreme fire behavior was observed as the fire moved rapidly through flashy fuels. Current threats include a repeater, two mine sites and the

Beaver Dam Wilderness. Low relative humidity, inaccessibility and rough terrain are hampering containment objectives.

CARLA LAKE, Fort Greely Army Base. This fire is 15 miles southwest of Delta Junction. Crews were able to hold containment lines despite warmer and drier conditions. Mop-up and rehabilitation efforts are going well.

#### OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH HAS BEEN POSTED IN NORTHERN FLORIDA FOR LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY. The remainder of the state will be hot with scattered thunderstorms. High temperatures will range from the 90's to near 100.

Southern Nevada, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico, and northwestern Texas will be sunny and hot with low relative humidity. Winds will be 10-20 MPH throughout the area. Temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's, with highs reaching from 100 to 115 in the lower elevations.
