

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 WEDNESDAY, MAY 6, 1998 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Large fire activity continued in the Northern Rockies. Minor initial attack activity was reported elsewhere. NICC processed requests for a shower unit and a type II helicopter for the Northern Rockies and an Infrared aircraft for Canada. Alberta has 5 major fires burning for 41,760 hectares (103,147 acres). The town of Swan Falls has been evacuated with the towns of Chisholm, Hondo and Smith on a two hour evacuation alert. A forest fire southeast of Mexico City, Mexico has killed 15 people and injured 11 more. No other information was available.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRES:

GOAT CREEK, Northwest Montana State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Gauger) is assigned. This human caused fire is 31 miles southeast of Kalispell. Steep slopes are limiting suppression, although effective action is taking place on 2 of 3 divisions.

OUTLOOK: Western Montana will be mostly sunny with 15-25 MPH winds. High temperatures will be in the 70's.

Minnesota will have NEAR RED FLAG CONDITIONS due to low humidities and gusty southeast winds ahead of a cold front. The far western portion of Minnesota and southern Wisconsin will have a chance of thunderstorms today. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's.

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN SOUTHEAST NEW MEXICO DUE TO GUSTY SOUTHWEST WINDS. New Mexico will be partly cloudy with southwest winds up to 25 MPH in the southeast. High temperatures will be in the 60's to mid 70's in the mountains and north, with upper 70's to lower 90's in the south.

West Texas will be hot and dry. High temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's.
