

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 FRIDAY, MAY 8, 1998 - 0530 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity was reported yesterday. NICC processed various overhead requests. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Minnesota, Wisconsin, Louisiana, Texas, New Mexico and Arizona.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN SOUTHERN NEW MEXICO FOR INCREASING WINDS AND CONTINUED DRY CONDITIONS. New Mexico will remain windy and dry. There will be scattered afternoon thunderstorms in the mountains and north. Winds will be from the southwest at 15 to 30 MPH. High temperatures will be in the mid 50's to lower 70's in the mountains and north with 70's to 80's in the south.

West Texas will be windy and dry. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's and 90's and up to 105 along the Rio Grande River.

Western Montana will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 70's.

The Great Lakes States will be dry in the north with a chance of showers in the south. The area will have breezy northeast winds from 15 to 25 MPH. Temperatures will be cooler with highs in the upper 50's and 60's.
