

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
WEDNESDAY, MAY 13, 1998 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minor initial attack activity continues to be reported nationally. Very high and extreme fire indices continue to be reported in Minnesota, Texas, New Mexico and Arizona. Three fires continue to burn out of control in Alberta for 501,978 acres.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

CAMP WOOD HILL, Texas State. This fire is 6 miles west of Camp Wood burning grass and cedar in steep terrain. Several homes remain threatened.

BOOGY JORDAN, Florida National Forests. The fire is 4 miles east of Sumatra and is burning mostly in private timber.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR GUSTY SOUTHWEST WINDS IN NEW MEXICO. Arizona and New Mexico will be partly cloudy with a chance of showers and thunderstorms in Arizona and north and west New Mexico. Snow showers are expected in the higher elevations of Arizona. New Mexico will have 15-30 MPH southwest winds. High temperatures in the mountains will range from the mid 40's in Arizona to the 60's and 70's in the New Mexico. Highs in the lower elevations will be in the 70's in Arizona to the 80's and lower 90's in New Mexico. West Texas will be mostly sunny, warm and dry. High temperatures will be in the 80's to lower 90's.

Western Montana will be mostly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 60's.

Wisconsin and eastern Minnesota will be partly sunny and warm. A low pressure system will approach western Minnesota bringing increasing clouds with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. Michigan will be mostly cloudy with a chance of showers and thunderstorms as a cold front moves through. High temperatures will be in the 60's to the 70's in the north and 80's in the south.

Florida will be mostly sunny and dry. High temperatures will be in the 80's.
